This issue also includes the names of all our GHHSAA and faculty who are living LIFE members. We thank you for your financial support!




**Jeanne Elizabeth Smith Baxter '59**

## A Royal History of Homecoming

The origin of the word homecoming dates back to 1911 when an athletic director contacted the alumni of the University of Missouri to inaugurate the new location of their football field by "coming home" to attend a football game and a parade.

For the last 92 years, Grandview Heights has been celebrating homecoming. Over the years GHHS students have selected queens and kings, made elaborate decorations, continued annual traditions and created firsts spanning the 30s through the present homecoming celebration in 2022.

Grandview High School chose Bonnie Jean Martin, nicknamed "Johnny", as their first homecoming queen in 1930 and she rode in the homecoming parade. At that time, homecoming queens had

a single maid of honor, not a court of five girls. The senior class president might escort the Queen in celebration.

The Ohio State Journal of 1940 highlighted Grandview's queen with this headline – "Miss King is Named Queen for Grandview Homecoming". Miss King enjoyed as much fun out of the play on her name as her classmates did. In naming her maid of honor, the school stayed with the royal Scottish tradition of electing a Stuart. It was a coincidence that her maid of honor's name was Lee Stuart. Later, in the mid-1940s the student body elected ten girls; the seniors then selected five girls, one of which would become the queen. In 1943 the homecoming event was described in the yearbook before the football game. "The day was crisp and clear. Cheers rose from the stadium as the team ran out onto the field. Blue and white

streamers floated in the breeze as the band played the loyalty song ... the queen wished the co-captains good luck by presenting them with a kiss and a flower apiece".



Grandview's homecoming queen of 1949 was Dolores "Dee" DiMenna, now Rosati. She is 90 years old.

During WWII, the homecoming queen and court tradition continued and Grandview would always remember those alumni serving Uncle Sam in the Armed Forces.

### Moment in time

As the Highlander of 1931 documents the history and prophecy of the class of 1931, post-high school life was looming for all the graduates-to-be. They willed their talents to fellow schoolmates. They performed in *The Swan* and *The Queen's Husband*. They had their baby pictures and class pictures in the yearbook, which was then called the "annual." They had a Thrift Club whose object was "to increase the number of accounts in the school bank and to promote regularity in banking." Along with the usual sports such as football and basketball, they participated in track, swimming and tennis, and won the first Central Buckeye League Championship in golf. The Girls' Athletic Association sponsored tennis, hockey, basketball, table tennis, foul shooting, volleyball, baseball and track. The calendar of the class of 1930-31 had the usual social events, starting with the choosing of the first homecoming queen (pictured here). Bonnie Jean Martin was an athlete, an officer of the freshman class, a singer in the chorus of *Why the Chimes Rang* and was in the cast of *The Swan*. She was a member of the L.A.L. Sorority. Bonnie Jean, nicknamed "Johnny," resides in Upper Arlington in the same house she has lived in for 70 years. She has 10 grandchildren and 25 great-grandchildren. She was born Nov. 29, 1913, and will turn 99 this month.

# Memories



Later in the 1940s, the 1933 song "You Gotta Be A Football Hero" was sung at the football game.

The tradition of a kiss changed from the Queen kissing the co-captains to the football captain kissing the Queen.

The 1950s showed no sign of kissing the Queen as the emphasis became decorating for the event. This picture from 1953 shows a peacock-shaped crown. One Grandview alumni said, "For the 1957 homecoming stage where the queen and her attendants sat for the assembly, Judy Whirrett Finn and I used colored chalk dust to color pappas grass for decorating around the chairs. If I remember correctly, we used various shades of pink. The queen, Mary Anne Penzone, wore a red dress. The chairs were made of wood and painted white with



silver sequins pasted on for decoration. Some of the guys made them. We were guided by the art teacher, Miss Pickering (Miss Pick). In other years, white wrought iron lawn furniture was

rented for the occasion. Back then a tradition was to borrow Cadillac convertibles from Upper Arlington residents to drive the queen and her court around the football field at halftime. I was

one of the kids that got to go to Arlington and pick up a car and drive it to the high school. That was considered a privilege."

Occasionally in the '60s guest speakers would be invited to the assembly. Little girls were added to the celebration to bring the queen her crown. The class president gave gifts to the homecoming court.

In 1965, Kathy McQuilkin was crowned Grandview's homecoming queen. She went on to become The Ohio State University's queen as a freshman even though she was disqualified temporarily in 1966. *(article Makio Jan. 1, 1967)*

## Ye Olde Homecoming

The victory bell's tolling signalled the climax of the 1966 Homecoming festivities. On the eve of the game, students disguised as knights, serfs, dragons and witches crowded onto campus streets. All lines led to the rally where queen finalists, the football team and coach Woody Hayes were introduced. Later at Mershon, students were entertained by Chad Mitchell, The Harmonaires, and Gary and the Hornets. There was also dancing at the Union to the music of Warren Covington. This year, the biggest news at Homecoming was the disqualification of top-ten queen finalist Kathy McQuilkin, whose skit ran over the time limit.

She was reinstated as a candidate, however, and went on to be crowned Homecoming Queen. Runners-up were Sandy Ellenwood, Fay Kimie Yamashita, Sheryl Lamp and Linda Stitzlein.

# Distinguished Alumni

## GHSAA Distinguished Alumni

### Caroline Thomas Harnsberger



This is a continuation from our last issue of a feature story on Caroline Harnsberger '20, who graduated in a class of 13 students. GHHSAA recognized her as one of the first five GHHSAA Distinguished Alumni in 2006.

Caroline's passionate pursuit of eclectic interests drew on her many talents and the breadth of her accomplishments is extraordinary. She's remembered as an internationally recognized Mark Twain authority, author, accomplished musician, music store proprietor and pilot.

**Mark Twain Authority:** As a child, she was introduced to Twain's wit and wisdom by her father, who had a full set of Twain books. That collection fueled her lifelong interest in Twain. In a 2006 interview, Caroline said "I read everything of his I could get my hands on."

She enjoyed highlighting Twain's humor but had trouble finding where specific Twain quotes came from, so she began

the task of indexing Twain's clever sayings and subject matter in a card file. Excelling at indexing, she once said, "A book without an index is like soup without salt—no good." That card file project, along with her interest and fascination with research, led her to compile those quotes for her first book, *Mark Twain at Your Fingertips* (1947).

During the next three decades she wrote additional books about Twain: *Mark Twain: Family Man* (1960); *Mark Twain's Views of Religion* (1961); *Everyone's Mark Twain* (1972); *Mark Twain on Horseback* (1978); *Mark Twain Loved Cats* (1981); *Mark Twain's Clara* (1982); *The Remaining Twain* (UNK). In the early 1940s she traveled to Hollywood to meet Twain's daughter, Clara Clemens. The two women became friends, resulting in a 20-year correspondence of 800 letters from 1942 until Clara's death in 1962.

This relationship provided Caroline access to Mark Twain's unpublished notes, letters and his marginal commentary in his personal library. She later wrote *Mark Twain's Clara* (1982), based on her relationship with Clara. Prominent Mark Twain impersonators such as Hal Holbrook (*Mark Twain Tonight!*) and Richard Henzel (*Mark Twain In Person*) considered Caroline a valued script consultant for



television and stage productions about Twain. In 2003, she was the special guest of honor at Mark Twain's 150th birthday party at Delmonico's in New York City. The event was a re-

creation of Twain's 70th birthday party held there in 1905.

Caroline did not limit her writing to Mark Twain. One project often led her to another. After

her first book was successful, her publisher urged her to compile a book of Abraham Lincoln quotations. That book was *The Lincoln Treasury* (1950).

She wrote the first biography of Ohio Senator Robert A. Taft, called *A Man of Courage: Robert A. Taft* (1952), published the year Taft ran against Dwight D. Eisenhower for the Republican Party presidential nomination.

In later years she spent weeks at the Library of Congress researching American presidents for her *Treasury of Presidential Quotations* (1964), which became a Literary Guild bonus book. Caroline also met George Bernard Shaw (a then-reclusive 92-year-old Irish playwright, critic, and political activist) at his English country home. After Shaw's death in 1950, she obtained the rights to publish a book that compiled Shaw's quotations - *Bernard Shaw, Selections of His Wit and Wisdom* (1965).

Some of her other books include *The Life and Times of James Oscar Thomas* (1974) (the story of her father's life and times); *Winnetka: The Biography Of A Village: Including A Chronology, 1800 Through 1976* (1977); *Gods & Heroes: A Quick Guide to the Occupations, Associations & Experiences of the Greek & Roman Gods & Heroes* (1977).






