### President's Letter



Dear Fellow Bobcats:

Your Alumni Association has enjoyed a great year so far!

At the GHHS Class of '11 Scholarship Assembly, we awarded 3 scholarships:

- \$2,500 in honor of Larry Larson, former GHHS coach, teacher and Athletic Director
- \$2,500 Alumni Memorial Scholarship
- \$1,000 Carol Sue Herd Greenisen '55 Scholarship
- \$1,500 Brotherhood of Rooks Ted J. Eaton Scholarship (GHHSAA provided administrative support)

Scholarship recipients are highlighted in the following pages. Note that 78 of the 81 Year 2011 graduates are going on to college. Two graduates are entering the military and one directly into the workforce.

The Association was instrumental in finishing the Auditorium renovation. We issued a \$10,000 challenge grant which was matched by the Grandview Heights/Marble Cliff Education Foundation and now all seats are scheduled to be upholstered and named for donors. The Association coordinated a special collection in honor of Tom Hayes '67 and this memorial to Tom will complete a special handicap seating section.

The Memorial Day Parade saw more graduates than ever before marching behind the GHHSAA banner. We had close to 150 people and several vehicles. Everyone had blue and white balloons and we gave candy to the "bobkittens" sitting on the curb as we walked the mile and one-half route down First Avenue. The classes of '50 and '51 had their joint reunion that weekend and participated. Perhaps other classes will do the same next year.

We extend our thanks to those who responded to our recent donation request to help pay for this newsletter. We strive to keep the Association on sound and professional footing. The endowment with the Columbus Foundation is used for scholarships and is healthy and we don't use that capital to pay for the newsletter, website or other operating expenses. These costs continue to increase and the Board has voted to raise annual dues from \$25 to \$30 and the Life Membership to \$300. ## The History of Grandview—The Pool

The ole' swimming hole was located near the site of the current Dublin Road water treatment plant. Members of the community hauled in sand to create a beach and built a beach house for changing clothes.

The current pool, shown in this 1996 photo, was constructed in 1932. See the original design drawing. It was the largest community swimming facility in the Columbus area. It was built by the Grandview Swimming Pool Co. of 1311 Grandview Avenue and was operated on a limited membership plan. The original officers of the company were C.A. Niple, J.S. Radebaugh and Henry Taylor.

The city of Grandview bought the pool and made needed renovations in 1978. There are currently 1621 members this year including 144 members on the swim team.

Do you remember the dusty



gravel parking lot, how it was oiled to control dust and how hot it was afterwards? Remember how cold the water was because it was spring fed? Your pool memories might also include corner tag, jump tag, penny candy at the concession stand, swim lessons, staying until the lights came on, dive-in movies, pool parties, crushes on lifeguards, the high dive and the boys playing basketball on the court in the corner.



## Volunteer Extraordinaire

Over the years, Terry Smith '54 has been a supremely valuable GHHSAA volunteer in numerous capacities. The Board wishes to extend its appreciation to Terry for his work and also let you know a little bit about him.

Some of Terry's early memories of Grandview are in the 1940's. He recalls ice being delivered to homes for 'ice boxes', peddlers who sold only umbrellas or knife sharpeners and salesmen with push-carts of strawberries. Milk and bread were also regularly delivered to homes. He remembers summer canning of garden bounty during World War II.



Terry graduated from the University of Chicago and then spent 2 years in the U.S. Army.

He returned to Grandview where he served as Administrator for Boulevard United Presbyterian Church. Next, Terry and his mother, Helen Smith, operated the Grandview Smith Bridge Studio from 1965 to 1975

and he worked at the American Contract Bridge League national headquarters overseeing the tournament division for 6 of those years. He then spent 25 years in southern California working as an administrator/director of operations with half

a dozen different small companies engaged in the computer industry. He retired in '99 and returned to Ohio. Terry now resides in Marble Cliff.

Terry served many years on the GHHSAA Board of Trustees as the Treasurer. He also serves as a board member emeritus for the Grandview Heights Marble Cliff Historical Society. He probably knows who used to live in your Grandview house and who lived next door, too!


