In those days, The Agonis Club (a service organization) sponsored an honors banquet for scholar-athletes chosen from each Central Ohio high school. I represented Grandview in 1952. Others included Ralph Gulielmi for 1951. At the banquet, I garnered some attention because my older twin brothers, Jack and Jim Rudy, shared the award from Grandview in 1948. I was seated next to another award winner, Howard Cassady, from Central High School, a star running back in the city league. We chatted together. Just two years later, Howard "Hop-Along" Cassady was an All-American running back and finished the 1955 year as winner of the Heisman award under Woody Hayes on his first championship team. I never fail to chuckle when I thumb through the scrapbook and remember my underestimation when we met.

Pool paragon Sid Hall '53 reels in more medals

In the Y Masters National Swimming Championships last April in Fort Lauderdale, which attracted 417 competitors, ages 18 to 90, Sid Hall took first in the 500 yard freestyle (8:25.78), second in the 200 and 100 free and third in the 50 free. Eighty-three is the new 23.

As an encore at this year's U.S. Masters National Championships in Indianapolis, as part of a field of 2,378 swimmers, ages 18 to 95, he was first in the 200 free (3:01.05) and third in the 500, 100 and 50 free. He bettered the times he posted in Florida in three of his four races. His 50 time in Indy (34.08) was his fastest in two years.

Hall swims for 60 to 75 minutes four to five times a week at the Y, his workouts ranging from 2,400 to 3,000 yards. He also does weight training twice a week.

"I guess when I started (Masters swimming) in 1991, I didn't think about how long it might last," said Hall, who still runs his own financial services business in Mansfield. "I thought, well, it's a way I can stay in the shape and maybe encourage others. People get older and feel they can't do something. Or, in my case, I've gone through several major surgeries, and you can come back. If I can encourage one person to have a better life, then my life is worthwhile."

The two surgeons who performed his spinal surgery told him had he not been someone who exercises regularly, he would not have been a candidate, at his age, for the operation.

"There's three things that keep me going," said Hall, who also swims for a team called the O*H*I*O Masters (Old Hearts Inspire Others). "I want to keep my body going as best I can, I want to keep inspiring and improving, and I want to compete."

Good thing Hall is young and able to bounce back quickly from having those two surgeries.

In between surgeries last year, Hall managed to keep a streak alive. Since 1991, only one year has he not been ranked in the top 10 in his age group. He returned to the pool after his shoulder surgery in time to compete in the last sanctioned meet of the season.



He turned in three top 10 finishes. Streak intact.

Hall likes to joke that he "took a 37-year taper" when explaining his 37-year layoff from swimming. He won a pair of state championships and was named a high school All-American at Grandview Heights, but he didn't compete again until he was 55.

Hall and his wife of 58 years, Nancy, a native of Rochester, N.Y., moved to Mansfield in 1974 and raised two children.

Musical Musings

Lowell Riley, a popular choral director at First Community Church, started Vaude-Villities in the early 1940s with Dr. Bob Murphy. Lowell became choral music teacher at both Grandview and Upper Arlington Schools at the same time. This high-energy talent didn't just teach vocal music, he organized several choruses that performed at different levels, including a "varsity" chorus. He arranged the music that was sung bringing popular music, including show tunes, into the school.



When Grandview and Arlington met at the end of the football season, the halftime show was Lowell's combined Arlington-Grandview girl chorus singing Lowell's adaptation of "You've got to be a football hero (to get along with the Grandview girls)". In 1946, the Grandview chorus appeared at the Palace Theater. Lowell would continue to direct the Tri-Village Vaude-Villities for another 45 years and include many Grandview girls in those productions. In 1992, a reunion was held to honor Lowell and the spirit of Vaude-Villities.

"Bobcat Duo"

"Bobcat Duo" leads the 1955 College All-Stars to a stunning victory over the Cleveland Browns

Two 1951 GHHS graduates, Ralph Guglielmi and Tad Weed, led the 1955 College All-Stars to a stunning victory over the Cleveland Browns.

The All-Star game was played annually in Chicago in August, starting in 1934 and continuing until 1976. The game featured the defending NFL champion versus a select group of college all-stars. The defending champion that year was the vaunted Cleveland Browns, led by legendary coach Paul Brown. They had many all-pro players returning from their championship season of 1954-55, including George Ratterman, Ed Modzelwski, Curly Morrison, Ray Renfro, Horace Gillom, Pete

Brewster, Dante Lavelli, Walt Michaels, Lou Groza, Chuck Noll, Bob Gain, and Mike McCormack. The Browns won that year's NFL Championship with a 9-2-1 record. In all the years this annual All-Star game was played, the college all-stars only won six games, but none came close to comparing with the stunning upset of the Cleveland Browns in 1955. For sure, the All-Stars were "loaded" with great players, All-Americans, etc., but two 1951 Bobcats were destined to lead the college boys to victory. The College All-Stars beat the Browns by a score of 30-27. Ralph Guglielmi was named MVP of the game, playing the entire game at quarterback and completing 10 of 19 passes. The runner-up MVP was Tad Weed, who kicked three field goals and every extra point.

Ralph was fourth place in the Heisman Trophy race that year, playing all four years at Notre Dame. Tad was Ohio State's pre-

mier field goal kicker for Woody Hayes. Paul Brown heaped praise on the all-stars, but none more than on Ralph and Tad. Ralph was selected in the first round of the NFL draft in 1955 and spent seven years with the Washington Redskins. Tad was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers and spent one year in the NFL. These two legends mad Grandview graduates proud and remain two of the most popular and famous athletes in GHHS history to date.




GHHSAA Scholarship

Cradle of Coaches

You may have heard of the "Cradle of Coaches," coined after the numerous football coaches who had ties with Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. Most of the coaches were head coaches at Miami (some assistant coaches), but all of them went on to great fame as head football coaches at major college football programs. They include Earl Blake, Paul Brown, Woody Hayes, Weeb Eubank, Sid Gillman, Ara Parseghian, Bo Schembeckler, and Jim Tressel. Believe it or not, Grandview High School could equally qualify for the "Cradle of Coaches" in the high school arena, especially in Ohio.



I. Stanton Jones - 1919-1924

Coach Jones is considered the first football coach at GHHS. Although he left the coaching profession in 1924, he went 8-1 that year and beat arch rival Bexley 53-0. He set a high bar for all future football coaches to emulate.



C. V. Money - 1924-1926

After spending two successful seasons at Grandview, Coach Money took the head coaching job at Hanover College in Indiana (taking with him Ralph Anderson). He later became head football coach at University of Louisville, Ferris University, and Northern Michigan.



Clemence Zwick - 1930-1934

Coach Zwick spent five very successful seasons at Grandview, and beat arch rival Upper Arlington 4 out of 5 years. We were unable to find any history on him after he left Grandview.



Jim Scott - 1935-1938

Coach Scott spent four successful seasons at Grandview. In 1936, he had Grandview's first undefeated season, going 8-0-1 and outscoring his opponents 222-6 (8 shutouts). He also had an 8-1 record during his four-year tenure. Like Coach Zwick, we were unable to find any history after he left Grandview.



W.H.H. "Tippy" Dye - 1939-1940

Coach Dye led the team for the first-ever undefeated and untied record in GHHS history - 9-0 in 1939. He went to Brown University as an assistant in football, then to Ohio State as an assistant in both football and basketball programs. He served several years as head basketball coach at Ohio State University, then several outstanding seasons as head basketball coach at University of Washington and athletic director at Nebraska

and Northwestern University.



Charles Thackara - 1941 and 1946-1947

Coach Thackara went 23-2-1 during his three years at GHHS and defeated Upper Arlington two out of the three years he faced the evil Golden Bears. He went to Hamilton, Ohio, as a successful head football coach and later an administrator.

Pug Hood - 1942-1943

Coach Hood (*not pictured*) led two successful seasons before moving to South High School where he had a great record, retiring from South in 1954.



Bill Doolittle - 1948

While Coach Doolittle spent only one year at GHHS, he went on to become a legendary head football coach at Western Michigan for 11 years (1964-1974). He was well known for the bow ties he wore everywhere, including on the sidelines.



Bill Hess - 1949

Coach Hess also spent only one year as head coach at GHHS but had an 8-0-1 record, tying the last game vs. Upper Arlington 0-0. He went to Ohio University in 1958, where he was the head football coach for 20 years (1958-1977) and won many MAC championships and "coach of the year" awards.



Hugh Hindman - 1950-1952

After two years at GHHS, Coach Hindman left to become an assistant under Woody Hayes, before going to Ohio University to become assistant coach for Bill Hess at Ohio University. He became athletic director at Ohio State University for several years in the '70s, and was the person who had to fire Woody Hayes in 1978.



Robert Dudley - 1953-1954

After two years at Grandview, Coach Dudley went to Bowling Green State University to become an assistant to Doyt Perry from 1955-1970.



Bob Duncan - Early to mid-1950s

An assistant football coach to several coaches and head baseball coach at GHHS, Coach Duncan left Grandview in 1957 to become head football coach at South High school, enjoying a great deal of success. He then went on to Lakewood High School in Cleveland, winning several titles in a league which included many large high schools.



Robin Priday - 1955-1966

Coach Priday enjoyed a very successful 11-year career at Grandview, including a record 9-0 first season that ended with beating Upper Arlington in a "standing room only" game 12-0. He had 51 wins overall and was one of the most popular coaches in Grandview history. He became principal of the junior high after he retired from coaching.



Rich Seils - 1970

Coach Seils only served one year as head coach at Grandview before leaving for an assistant football position at Defiance College. He then became the head football coach at Otterbein College for 10 successful seasons.



Larry Larson - 1976-1982

This man is easily the most beloved coach, teacher, administrator in Grandview history. A highlight of his head football coaching tenure at Grandview would be his 1979 team, who went undefeated, going 9-0-1. Coach Larson went on to become the Athletic director for many years and is known as Mr. High School Sports around the central Ohio area.



Bill Brown - 1983-1994

Coach Brown holds the distinction of being the "winningest coach" in the history of Grandview with 52 victories.

Grandview/Bobcat Nation can look back with pride on all of these wonderful coaches who positively influenced many student and student athletes over the decades. Thanks, Coaches!
