

George Linn '52 Honored by the SEC



Former Alabama standout George Linn, a starter on the famed 1956 "Rocket 8" team and a 1954 Grandview graduate, is one of 14 former greats selected as 2017 Allstate® Southeastern Conference Basketball Legends.

Linn, a first team All-American in 1956, averaged 22.2 points per game during his All-America season, the fifth-highest scoring average in program history. A member of head coach Johnny Dee's "Rocket 8" team, he led the Tide to its first postseason ranking at No. 12 in 1955 before improving to a program-best No. 5 during the 1956 season, when he helped the team compile a 21-3 record and win an SEC title. That same year, the Tide finished the season as the first-ever undefeated team in SEC history (14-0) until 40 years later when Kentucky accomplished the feat in 1996.

Linn hit the longest shot in program history when he nailed a full court shot measuring 84 feet 11 inches in Foster Auditorium at the end of the first half vs. North Carolina in 1955. The shot, which remains the longest shot made in a sanctioned NCAA basketball game, was featured in Sports Illustrated and is commemorated at the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. A brass marker was placed on the gym floor to indicate the location of the shot.

After college, Linn earned a spot as an alternate on the 1956 Olympic Team that won the gold medal in Melbourne, Australia. Linn was drafted by the Boston Celtics with the sixth pick in the third round of the 1956 NBA Draft. He still ranks among Alabama's all-time leaders in scoring (19th - 1,444 career points) and rebounding (20th - 722).

Linn, along with the entire honoree class, was honored at the 2017 SEC Men's Basketball Tournament, held March 8-12, at Bridgestone Arena in Nashville, Tenn.

Sports Hall of Fame 2017 Inductees

The Grandview Heights High School Sports Hall of Fame was established in 1989 to honor Grandview's outstanding individuals and teams who have made contributions on and off the playing fields and courts. The program has long been a school and community favorite.

The commitment and passion of Gary Fekete '67 to build a program that has passed the test of time is certainly appreciated throughout Grandview. Entering the 25th anniversary year, the Sports Hall of Fame has recognized more than 100 individuals for their achievements.

As founder and first chairman of the GHHS Sports Hall of Fame, Fekete selected five members of the Grandview community to assist in constructing a quality program that makes recipients proud. We thank the committee members, past, present, and future, and extend special appreciation and gratitude to Gary Fekete for a job well done.

Alfred G. Sargent

Alfred G. Sargent '26, a charter Varsity "G" member, was a four-sport letter winner for the Bobcats, as he excelled in football, basketball, baseball, and golf. As a member of the Bobcat Basketball team, he earned First-Team All-County and First-Team All-Regional honors. During his senior season, he was a part of the Grandview team that won the county basketball championship.

A talented athlete in all facets, Alfred succeeded mostly on the links as a golfer. As a sophomore and team captain, he led the Bobcats to the golf championship. During his senior season, he led the Bobcats to second place in the Franklin County Golf Tournament.

In 1923, at the age of 15, he was the youngest competitor in the Franklin County Amateur Golf Tournament where he made it to the semi-finals. Down two strokes going into the 16th hole, he sunk a 45-foot shot from the rough side of a hill. After the Franklin County Tournament, he entered the Western Junior Golf Tournament in Chicago where he finished in the Top 16, and also competed in a tournament in Athens, Ohio, where he had the second-best total round by an amateur. In 1924, he was awarded a junior membership to Scioto Country Club, something that was not given by the club often.

After graduating from Grandview, he attended The Ohio State University and was a member of the Buckeye golf team. He was captain his freshman year, and earned Varsity O status his sophomore year.

From 1932-1939, he was the Golf Pro at Inverness Country Club in Toledo, and was succeeded by PGA Hall of Famer Byron Nelson. He won two Toledo golf tournaments, and competed in four U.S. Opens.



Jill Swary Walker

Jill Swary Walker '98 was a three-sport athlete and earned a total of 12 varsity letters in basketball, soccer, and track.

As a four-year letter winner and two-time captain for the Lady Bobcats basketball team, she earned numerous accolades during her career. She was named second-team All-Buckeye Athletic Conference (BAC) her sophomore and junior years. As a senior, Jill was named the BAC Ohio Division Player of the Year, District 10-Division 3 Player of the Year, Central District-Division 3 First-team, All-Ohio Third-team, and was an Ohio Scholar Athlete. She was also a part of the 1997-1998 BAC Championship team.

As a member of the Lady Bobcat soccer team, Jill was a four-year letter winner and three-time captain. In both her junior and senior year campaigns, Jill was awarded First-team All-Independent League and Second-team All-District. She also played on the District All-Star Soccer team her senior year.

Jill was also a four-year letter winner for the Bobcat track team. She earned First-team All-BAC honors as a sophomore, junior, and senior. As a junior, she was first-team All-District and placed fifth in the regional meet. After graduating from GHHS, Jill attended Wittenberg University where she earned a Bachelors Degree in Middle Childhood Education. She was also a four-year member of the Wittenberg Women's Basketball team. Post-Wittenberg, she earned a Master's degree from The Ohio State University. Jill has coached both middle school girls' basketball and soccer for Grandview.

Jill is married to Pete Walker and they have two children, Dillon and PK. She is the daughter of Greg and Kathy Swary, and her brothers, Joe and Jacob, are also graduates of GHHS.

Todd Lovegrove


Todd Lovegrove '00 was a three-sport athlete, earning a total of 12 letters in football, tennis, and basketball.

As a four-year starter for the Bobcat football team, Todd played a variety of positions including tight end, wide receiver, quarterback, linebacker, safety, and punter. He earned Buckeye Athletic Conference (BAC) honors his junior and senior years.

Todd was also a four-year member of the Bobcat tennis team. As a freshman, he played third-singles, and played first singles his remaining three years. He earned BAC All-League honors his junior and senior years.

Although he had success in every sport he played at GHHS, Todd truly made his mark on the hardwood for the Basketball Bobcats. His career individual honors include: All-BAC his junior and senior years, a Columbus Dispatch Scholar Athlete, Central District Player of the Year, and First-Team All-Ohio his junior and senior years. He also scored more than 1,000 points during his career. He was fortunate to be a member of four successful teams under Coach Ray Corbett. Todd's team highlights include: a District and Regional title, and a trip to the 1998 State Final Four during his sophomore season; a BAC and District title, and a trip the Elite Eight during his junior season; and a BAC title during his senior season.

Todd attended Miami University and graduated Magna Cum Laude with a Bachelors Degree in Finance and Accounting. He is the son of Matt and Shelley Lovegrove, and brother to Phil and Ericca. He and his wife Annie have three children.



GHHS Baseball - 1922

When this photograph was taken in 1922, the GHHS baseball team was the youngest sport in the district. What had been a rather lackluster beginning changed with the arrival of Roy Ohnsman (left) a talented, strong freshman pitcher. His back-up pitcher was senior Nor Simons (right) who also played first base. By the time Ohnsman graduated, the GHHS yearbook noted that the team was winning a majority of their games. The photograph is from the Alleyne Higgs Jones collection. The precise location of the photograph is not known but clearly indicates that residential streets were heavily rutted mud tracks.

You might say that Grandview inbreeding is a tradition in the Todd Family. We married in June 1965 and had three daughters between 1967 and 1970.

We were a military family and Jeff was a U.S. Air Force pilot on active duty and full-time

Reserve duty until he retired at 60. He flew 14 different aircraft in Vietnam, Bosnia, Somalia, Desert Storm, Desert Shield, Afghanistan and Iraq. I began my work in the area of exercise research in Air Force hospitals and later expanded it from Olympic teams and professional sports to pregnancy and chronic illness, until I retired at 62. Jeff volunteered for the Red Cross as a liaison between the military, law enforcement and the Red Cross during natural disasters and was an EMR. You might have seen him at the OSU events. He also is involved with "Healing Waters" program to teach wounded warriors to fly fish. I enjoy volunteering for OhioHealth Hospice and love gardening and preserving produce. Our three daughters, two granddaughters and families are thriving and surviving.

We both believe that the glue that has held our marriage together is our faith. You can't have a 62-year relationship with someone and not have difficulties. Through those times, we both always knew that the Lord meant us to stay together. ♥



Pictured left to right are (front) Peggy Gammill, Shirley Close, Angela McGrath, and Pat Donovan, and (back) Shirley Ann Arthur, Judy Cash and Ann Devlin. Unbeknownst to these students, the picture and their home addresses were also published in the Columbus Dispatch Service Edition, which was mailed to combat troops from Franklin County. All of the young women received a deluge of letters from soldiers, sailors, and marines across the world. None of the letters reportedly contained any marriage proposals. However, Judy Cash received the official title of "Dream Girl of the 163rd Company," a company of seamen from the Great Lakes Naval Training Center in Illinois.

Robin Priday

Family and friends mourn the loss of Robin Priday, 93, who passed away on Jan. 12, 2017. Robin Priday was born Aug. 23, 1923, in Colville, Washington. He married May Lentz in 1944 and together they had two children, Jan and Robin. He was preceded in death by his wife May, son Robin, two brothers Jim and Rick, and step-daughter and son-in-law Janet and Mike Tackett. He is survived by his loving wife and companion of 31 years, Carol Wright Irwin; daughter, Jan (Garry) Seitz; as well as children, Craig (Connie) Irwin,



Nancy Sheares, and Joan (Fred) Ritchey; and multiple grandchildren; and great grandchildren. He is also survived by his sisters-in-law, Helen Priday and Cathy Priday; nieces and nephews. Robin was a 1941 graduate of West Jefferson High School, where he played football. He went on to play quarterback at The Ohio State University and was member of the first Ohio State National Championship

team in 1942. In early 1943, he joined the U.S. Army Air Corps as a 2nd Lt. and became a pilot, as part of the 556th Bomb Squadron. Robin was starting quarterback on the 1945 OSU football team. Due to an injury, he was unable to play in 1946 but helped coach the OSU Freshman squad. After receiving his BS degree in 1947, Robin accepted his first coaching position in Mt. Sterling, OH, then moved on to coach football in Wilmington, and Troy, OH, before going to Grandview Heights HS in 1953 where he would remain until retirement in 1980. He coached football, basketball and track and eventually became the Junior High Principal. He also completed his Master's Degree at The Ohio State University. Robin was active in the West Side Lions Club, Dublin Lions Club, and Big Brothers Association. He was also instrumental in organizing associations and reunions for the OSU 1942 National Championship Team, 556th Bomb Squadron, and the 302nd Air Force Reserve Unit. He was named to the West Jefferson and Grandview Heights Sports Hall of Fame. His legacy lives on in the lives of his family, the players he coached, students he taught, and people whose lives he touched throughout his years of service to his country, community, and family. Ralph Vincent Guglielmi

Ralph Vincent Guglielmi, of Wallace, North Carolina, passed away on Jan. 23, 2017. He was 83. Born in Columbus, Ohio, in 1933, he was the only son to Italian immigrants Marino and Rose Guglielmi. Ralph made his mark in high school as an all-around student athlete at Grandview Heights High School. After receiving more than a combined 100+ collegiate academic and athletic scholarship offers in baseball, basketball and football, he decided to attend the University of Notre Dame from 1951-1955. With Ralph as a starting player, the Fighting Irish went 26-3-2, finishing in the top four teams in the country every year of his attendance. In 1953, the team went 9-0-1, as Notre Dame's backfield included fullback Neil Worden and halfbacks Johnny Lattner and Joe Heap. After Ralph's junior year, the famous coach, Frank Leahy, proclaimed Guglielmi as "the greatest quarterback I ever coached." Ralph went on to receive the unanimous nomination for the honor of All-American quarterback in 1954. In 1955, he was a member of the winning College All-Stars team securing MVP honors, and the same year became the number one draft pick of the Washington Redskins. Not only did he play for the Redskins, but also played for St. Louis Cardinals, New York Giants and Philadelphia Eagles, as well as playing football and becoming an officer for the US Air Force. On April 19, 2001, Guglielmi was inducted in the National Football Foundation's College Football Hall of Fame. After his NFL career, Ralph was a successful insurance agent, long-time business owner of restaurants and car dealerships and developed a successful computer forms company, Computer Business Supplies (CBS). After many years as a resident and almost daily golfer of the Congressional Country Club in Potomac, Maryland, Ralph and his wife retired to River Landing Golf Community in Wallace, NC., in 2003. He is survived by his wife of 42 years, Linda Doeringer Guglielmi; his son Ralph David Guglielmi and wife Laurie Maves; his daughter Lisa Marie Hofmann and husband Mark Hofmann; five grandchildren, Ralph Vincent Guglielmi II, Michael Anthony Guglielmi, Isabella Marie Hofmann, Livianna Noelle Hofmann and Elena Claire Hofmann; brother-in-law, Jeffrey W.
