Two heads - and four wheels - are smarter than one

As a new eighth-grade student at Grandview in 1954, I was learning the names of my classmates. One was Jere Shough who was in my home room and most of my classes. We both carried the Columbus Dispatch, then an afternoon paper that we delivered after school around 3:20 p.m.

A paper carrier's goal was to get to the paper station as quickly as possible to "sign up" for our papers, which would arrive after 4:00. Papers were supplied to us from the list - top to bottom, first in, first out.

Our problem was that our last class (seventh period) was shop class with Mr. Justus, at the high school. Even when we ran back to the junior high for our bicycles as school let out, we were always at the bottom of the paper list.

Being entrepreneurs, we decided to ride our bikes from junior high to high school after our 6th period class and leave them at the high school bike rack. After two days, we were told we couldn't ride bikes between classes.

Jere had the bright idea of

parking bikes at the high school when we returned to school after lunch. Jere got approval on this so we executed our plan, leaving our bikes at the high school and walking back to junior high for fifth period with plenty of time to spare. That smart thinking paid off as Jere and I were usually the first two at the newspaper station, always in the top 10 on that distribution list.

As I earned route money, I bought an English Racer three-speed bike. It was too light for carrying papers, I would ride home and switch to the sturdier bike I always used. It was a precursor to having two cars.

I was sorry to learn of Jere's death as I remember our paper-delivery career fondly.

Thanks for acknowledging all of the GHHS veterans over the years. It does not surprise me so many have served. Growing up in Grandview instilled in us a strong sense of civic responsibility. I know those values served me well in my lift.

After graduating in 1973, I enlisted in the Army as an infantryman and served in Germany. Upon leaving the Army in 1976, I attended The Ohio State University, earning bachelor's and master's degrees in history. I was an Army Intelligence officer and foreign area officer (Western

Europe). I served in several great units and assignments, including the 82nd Airborne Division, 5th Special Forces Group, 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment, and on the history faculty of the U.S. Air Force Academy. I deployed for both Operation Desert Storm and Enduring Freedom campaigns. In 2003, I deployed to Curb (Gitmo) for 16 months to serve as the Deputy Commander of the Joint Detention Operations Group. I retired from the Army in 2005. I earned a PhD and now work as the Command Historian for the Air Force Technical Applications Center at Patrick AFB in Melbourne, Fla.

I attribute my military service success directly to GHHS teachers Larry Weaver, who gave me the skills to perform which helped me as an intelligence officer briefer, and Bob Cullison, who took me under his wing and instilled in me a great passion for history.

Celebrating the Life of Jane Hess Harris '56



During high school, Jane was president of G.A.A. (Girls Athletic Association), participated in various sports, on the staff of the Bobcat school paper, Y Teens, and a member of the Homecoming Court.

After graduating from GHHS, she attended The Ohio State University, joined Kappa Alpha Theta sorority, and graduated with a bachelor's degree in Fine Arts.

Throughout her life, Jane was very active in different organizations, including many roles with the Grandview Heights High School Alumni Association, board member of the Grandview Heights/Marble Cliff Historical Society, member and treasurer of the Women's Auxiliary Board of the Buckeye Ranch, a docent and past docent chair for the Columbus Museum of Art.

Jane and her husband Ron Harris '56 were together for more than 20 years. They had a wonderful life with each other and traveled extensively throughout the United States and the world.

A lovely person, Jane was full of life and very artistic and witty.

She had a great love for Ron, her family and her friends. She will be greatly missed by all who knew her.

"For 13 years, Jane Hess was a dedicated Board member of the Grandview Heights/Marble Cliff Historical Society (GHMCHS). Elected to the Board in 2008, her dedication to the Society began six years earlier. Jane was encouraged to become involved by her friend and GHHS Alumnus Terry Smith. Jane and her husband Ron graciously hosted a GHMCHS Board meeting in their circa-1892 historic home in 2002 and subsequently offered their house for a future home tour. They became GHMCHS Life members that same year. Jane wore many hats during her GHMCHS tenure. She was also a member of the committee that maintained GHMCHS displays in the Grandview Bank Block breezeway. She was quick to volunteer as a home tour docent, staff tables during Grandview Lazy Days events, and represent GHMCHS during the Summer Farmers' Market. Her outgoing and warm personality was most evident when she and Ron regularly hosted a fall fish fry 'Board Meeting' at their residence and generously shared the salmon they brought back from their Alaska fishing trips."

"Jane has always been the equivalent of blue skies and sunshine after a rainy day. I can't remember any moment when she was negative and not willing to jump into any job that

needed to be done. She was so tall and lovely with fabulous kind eyes that looked at you with such deep interest that the mood of the room would warm and rise with fun when Jane came in. Her personality of



achieving goals as a group and being positive to keep hope alive was an ingredient she brought to every commitment she placed her heart into. Friends from her youth to this day say they never saw Jane lose her temper; she was always calm and steady.

A lasting memory we share with Jane would be our trip to the Hudson River Valley. The tour ended with a horrible rainstorm and we were stranded in La Guardia airport for nine hours, not knowing if we'd make it back to Columbus. We turned the terminal into a slumber party. Even strangers joined in on the sharing of travel adventures and souvenirs, etc. Finally, at 2 a.m., we had a very bumpy flight to Columbus. Jane's positive energy and sense of fun was the culture we shared intimately, never to be forgotten. She remains warmly in our hearts." *Carole Dale*



Bobcat (and a Cardinal) Help Light Up Lake Erie

I'm a Worthington Cardinal who is married to Maureen Flanagan ('64) and I thought I'd pass this along. Maureen and I are very involved with the [Marblehead Lighthouse and the U.S. Lifesaving Station Museum](#). I learned from a friend stationed at U.S. Coast Guard Station Detroit that a new Sentinel Class Fast Response Cutter will be commissioned this spring in New Orleans. This 154-foot ship will be named for John Curtis Scheurman '42. My Grandview connection also includes my mother Betty Levesay '38, who might have been a senior when Scheurman '42 was a freshman.

I gave a private tour of the lighthouse and lifesaving station to a young woman who is now at USCG Station Detroit (Belle Isle). She will be one of the "plankowners" and will deploy this winter to New Orleans to help crew the ship to Manama,

Bahrain, for its first duty cruise. The Scheurman will be WPC-1146 and is being built by Bollinger Shipyards.

An Army Vietnam veteran myself, I owned an exhibit design/manufacturing company in Columbus for 25 years. When we retired, I was drafted to manage the construction and design the exhibits for the new lifesaving museum at the Lighthouse State Park. The U.S. Lifesaving Service became the Coast Guard in 1915 and our Station Marblehead is the busiest on the Great Lakes. I was elected president of the Historical Society and you can learn more at www.marbleheadlighthouseohio.org. Our society contributed more than \$600K in new buildings and exhibits to the park in the past five years. We staff the park in the summer with about 80 volunteers.

John Curtis Scheuerman '42

"Although mortally wounded before he could deliver effective fire, he remained steadfast at his post in the face of imminent death, thereby contributing materially to the protection of his ship against further attack. Scheuerman's fearless action, great personal valor, and selfless devotion to duty under extremely perilous conditions were in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Naval Service."

—Silver Star Medal citation of John C. Scheuerman, LCI-319, 1943

As a young man, John Scheuerman had a penchant for getting into good-natured mischief, once helping his brother saw the roof off a sedan because they'd always wanted a convertible. After attending GHHS, where he was head cheerleader, he worked as a salesman at a clothing store and as the assistant manager at the Drexel Theater.

On Oct. 16, 1942, at age 18, Scheuerman enlisted in the Coast Guard. He was part of the commissioning crew of USS Landing Craft, Infantry (Large)-319, also known as LCI-319. The LCIs were expected to land troops on hostile beaches.

The early morning of Sept. 9, 1943, found LCI-319 drifting in the Gulf of Salerno preparing for the amphibious assault on the German-held Italian shoreline. In this battle, LCI-319 would not be landing troops. The crew specialized in combat salvage and towing stranded landing craft off the beach and out of danger.

The battle raged on all day. Despite enemy fire, Scheuerman and the other men in the deck division worked topside handling tow lines and cables, and dropping the anchors. In the air over the beaches, fighter aircraft still battled and Scheuerman ran to man his 20mm.



A German fighter dove toward LCI-319. Manning his 20 mm, Scheuerman coolly willed a clear shot, but his aim was obstructed by the nearby LCI. The fighter drew anti-aircraft fire from the other ships, sustained damage, and pitched downward. The aircraft cleared the top of the adjacent LCI and plunged toward the sea and out of control. However, its pilot sprayed LCI-319 with cannon and machine-gun fire in a final act of defiance before crashing between the two ships. Scheuerman was severely wounded in the chest as he resolutely stayed at his gun, determined to hit the enemy aircraft. His injuries were too severe to treat and he was pronounced dead after arriving at a British field hospital.

In his ten months and 19 days in the Coast Guard, 19-year-old Seaman 1/c John Scheuerman commissioned a ship, sailed across the Atlantic, served on three continents, and saw combat in two invasions before being killed in action. He was later posthumously awarded the Purple Heart Medal and Silver Star Medal for valor in combat.

John Scheuerman's courage and coolness under fire stands as an example to the men and women of the Coast Guard who still man their guns, determined to defend their shipmates and the allies of the United States. He is one of many distinguished combat heroes of the Long Blue Line and a Coast Guard Fast Response Cutter will soon be named in his honor.
