Making Movies, Making Memories

Rico Long's '52 filmmaking career began during his Grandview years when he and some classmates collaborated in making a number of 8mm films. After high school, Rico graduated from Ohio State University in 1956 with a degree in Radio-TV. While serving in the U.S. Army after college graduation, he was assigned to the Army Pictorial Center in New York City, given top-secret clearance and sent to the Nevada testing site to be in charge of filming secret atom bomb tests. He and his



crew shot 11 tests and then he shot Army projects across the United States. That hazardous duty qualified him for a visit to Washington, D. C., with Honor Flight in 2018, accompanied by his daughter Wendy. Following his military service, Rico worked as a film editor

for WTVN-TV and then joined the OSU Department of Photography and Cinema as a film editor, making films and overseeing student film productions. He became an assistant professor and taught film editing and production management until his

retirement in 1988. He served as president of the Columbus International Film Festival for 12 years, one of the oldest documentary/business/agency festivals in the country. For nearly 25 years, he and his wife Joyce reviewed films on WOSU Radio.

Class of 1963 Salutes 60 Years


These loyal Bobcats will hold their 61th Reunion during Alumni Weekend on Sept. 8 and 9. Events include:

I consider figurative art and portraiture painting as the core of my work. My passion for it developed

during high school art classes with 'Doc' Ekleberry. Doc taught me techniques to render the human form, along with different materials and mediums to achieve certain expressive effects. In college, I honed in on painting as my favorite medium, but I still carried with me a lot of core concepts that Doc introduced through technical drawing, charcoal, and pastels. We even worked on murals throughout the school where an entire art class would collaborate on an individual mural, often creating a new (and humorous) version of a famous work of art. Little did I know that

murals would become a major facet of what I do today!

Nick Stull received his BFA from Ohio Wesleyan University with a concentration in painting, drawing and sculpture. His experimental portraiture and figurative paintings have been exhibited locally, regionally, and nationally and he is represented by Sarah Gormley Gallery in Columbus, Ohio, and Red Arrow Gallery in Nashville, Tenn. Nick also owns an art and design company called Day Blink Creative LLC, where he produces large-scale murals, custom painting & portraiture, and branding & design projects. Joe Karlovec '04



The Franklin G. Burroughs-Simeon B. Chapin Art Museum showed a solo exhibition


by Joe Karlovec '04 (M.F.A. '15 Painting) "Private Property" during Summer 2022. This exhibition was hosted by Myrtle Beach's only art museum, offering exhibitions featuring paintings, textiles, sculpture, photography, video, ceramics, assemblage, collage and more. "At 5 years old, he'd do a drawing and you could see him get better and better," Jerry Karlovec '67 said. "It was his playground, if you will."

"He would draw a picture of a person and really make a study of it. There was such depth to the drawings," Linda Karlovec said.

The textile installations represent a new chapter in their son's artistic work, Jerry Karlovec said.

"He was always so interested in drawing, I always thought he would be an illustrator," he said. "It's so exciting to see him try new things and challenge himself."

Joe Karlovec credits his high school art teacher, Lee "Doc" Ekleberry, with helping encourage his interest in art. "In art class, you sometimes have to bring people out of their shell to spark the creative part of their brain," Joe said. "Doc knew how to do that. He saw that interest in me and gave me the

opportunity to explore my love of art and develop my skills." Joe Karlovec's interest and background in architecture, painting and landscape architecture inspires his recent body of work, which consists of 12 large-scale textile installations featuring photographic details of architectural spaces, landscapes and paintings. As Karlovec states, "I make textiles about landscape urbanism and postmodern architecture."

Using a jacquard loom, Karlovec weaves his photographic images into textiles. He then hand cuts his fiber imagery and reconstructs them into multi-layered fiber collages that seemingly undulate with a maze of interiors, facades and outdoor areas that form a large and winding, visually stunning space – albeit some of the objects and spaces often contradict one another. Beckoned by the towering scale of the textiles to explore the picture plane, the viewer may find themselves Considering their own relationships with the places in which they live and work, as well as their surrounding environments.

Joe Karlovec currently works

as the production manager at Farano Fine Art in West Palm Beach Fla. He received his bachelor of fine arts in interior architecture from the Cleveland Institute of Art and a master of fine arts in painting from Kent State University. Learn more at www.bigartnow.co/artists/joe-karlovec/.

Spotlight Distinguished Alumni

Distinguished Alumni

Caroline Thomas Harnsberger graduated from GHHS in 1920, in a class of 13 students, and she was honored as one of the first five GHHSAA Distinguished Alumni in 2006. This is the first of a two-part series about her achievements.

Caroline grew up in a musical family in Grandview and began playing the violin as a child. After finishing high school in 1920, she attended Northwestern University and then studied violin for three years at The Juilliard School of Music in New York. She finished her formal music education as an exchange student in Paris, studying violin for a year at the Conservatoire de Paris (the Paris Conservatory, a college of music and dance founded in 1795). She also played at Carnegie Hall in 1922.

In a 2006 interview with First Community Update, Caroline recalled "I had met my future husband in Upper Arlington before I left, and we decided to marry in Paris." She married Audley Harnsberger, a petroleum engineer with Pure Oil Company, and the couple settled in Winnetka, just outside of Chicago.


The Grandview Heights/Marble Cliff Historical Society noted

that Caroline and Audley lived in Winnetka for about 50 years until Audley passed away in 1981. During those years, Caroline raised three children, while also painting, researching, authoring books, running a business, flying and traveling. She played violin in the Women's Symphony Orchestra of Chicago for seven years and was also a founding member of the Evanston Symphony Orchestra, where she played violin for 37 years. In the mid-1960s she became the proprietor of a music store that sold stringed instruments and sheet music and repaired violins and guitars.

While they were married, Audley had a plane. When he began experiencing high blood pressure, Caroline earned her pilot license at age 59 so she could be his co-pilot. She organized all data she needed to fly at her fingertips into what became the book "Pilot's Ready Reference Manual (1962)". Caroline originally published the book under the name C.T.

Harnsberger. Her publisher thought pilots wouldn't take seriously a reference book on flying that was written by a woman. However, it became the definitive source for over 20 years and 12 editions.

Caroline Harnsberger shared her gifts with the world. She lived the last seven years of her life at First Community Village in Upper Arlington and died in 1991 at age 89.

The Amazing Doc Wu

I recently got the chance to visit with Pei-Hsing Lin Wu, aka Doc Wu, our beloved former GHHS chemistry teacher. Doc Wu is an amazing woman with an inspirational outlook on life that she's carried through her 98 years. She wrote an autobiography entitled

"Unintended Journey Across China: The Story of a Refugee," along with cookbooks and a book about birdwatching. She enjoys teaching first- and second-grade students about science and lives in a home designed by a student of Frank Loyd Wright.

Her brother Jimmy Lin was a faculty member at the University of Maryland and pioneered the first lateral transistor, making the integrated circuits we have today possible.

Doc Wu has two daughters, Anne and Mei and a granddaughter, Eva. She would enjoy hearing from former students, for any occasion or reason.

Sports Hall of Fame 2023 Inductees



Kelly Ann Kasser '85

was a four-sport athlete who earned ten varsity letters - one in track and field, two in softball, three in basketball and four in volleyball.

She was a three-year starter for the girls' basketball team and was team captain her senior year. She was also named first-team All-CBL her senior year. Kelly was a two-year starter for the softball team in her freshman and sophomore years before turning to track and field her senior year. She was named captain and was a part of the 1600-meter relay team that set a school record of 4:21.6.

As a four-year starter for the volleyball team and three-year team captain, she was a two-time All-CBL second-team selection, first-team All-District, and was the first volleyball player in GHHS history to be named to the All-Ohio team. She was also awarded the Milky Way All-Star award and was the only female athlete selected by the Columbus Citizen-Journal as Athlete of the Week in 1984.




Katy Seabolt '99

was a three-sport athlete in soccer, basketball and track who earned ten varsity letters.

As a four-year letter winner and two-time team captain, she helped lead the girls' soccer team to three league championships in 1996, 1997 and 1998. She achieved significant individual accomplishments including All-BAC (1995-1998), All-District (1995-1998), All-State (1998), Team Most Valuable Player (1996-1998), assist leader (1996-1998) and leading goal scorer (1995-1998). She graduated as the girls' soccer team's all-time leader in assists and goals.

As a four-year letter winner and two-time team captain, Katy led the girls' basketball team to two league championships and an undefeated regular season during the 1997-1998 season. Katy achieved significant individual accomplishments, including All-BAC (1996-1999), All-District (1996-1999), BAC Player of the Year Runner-Up (1998 & 1999) and Team Leading Scorer (1997-1999).



Colin Todd '01

is a fourth-generation GHHS graduate who began his soccer career in eighth grade on the high school's first club soccer team. As a sophomore, he was a starter on Grandview's first varsity boys' soccer team. The team exceeded all expectations in their first season and received a district ranking with a 14-4-1 record.

As a junior, he captained the soccer team to a first-place tie in the Buckeye Athletic Conference (BAC). Colin was the team's most valuable player and earned first-team All-Conference honors. As a senior, he recorded 23 goals and 15 assists as the team made school history as the quickest team to become district champions and made it to the regional finals in just their third season. Colin scored the lone goal in the district championship game. He was the team MVP again, first-team All-BAC and District, and was the BAC Player of the Year. He was also an Academic All-Ohio honoree. After college, Colin served as an assistant coach for eight years.

Colin is the nephew of fellow Hall of Famer Mark Todd.



Paige Lachey '10

was a three-sport athlete who earned 12 varsity letters in track and field, basketball and soccer. Paige was the captain of the track team her junior and senior seasons, and the team won three consecutive Mid-State League titles, which were the first three in school history; two district championships; and a regional runner-up. She held the school record in the 100-meter hurdles, and still holds the records in the 4x200-meter and 4x400-meter relays. She was all-MSL in 2008, 2009 and 2010 in various events including the 100-meter hurdles, high jump, and the 4x200-meter and 4x400-meter relays. She was a district champion in the 100-meter hurdles, 4x200-meter relay and 4x400-meter relay, and qualified for the state meet in all three events. She was all-state in the 4x400-meter relay.

As captain of the basketball team her senior season, Paige led the team in rebounds, steals and points. She was a first-team all-MSL and Top 10 Division II, III & IV Player in District 10 in the 2009-2010 season. She is the girls' basketball all-time leading rebounder with 799. Paige was the captain of the soccer team her senior season and was first-

team all-MSL in 2008 and 2009. Paige returned to Grandview Heights as a volunteer assistant soccer coach for two years during college and was an assistant track coach for five years during and after college.

Congratulations to the four newest inductees in the Grandview Heights Sports Hall of Fame.

Eligibility

To be considered for induction after a ten-year period (i.e., ten years since contribution commenced), the individual must meet at least one of the following requirements

Alumni of Grandview - made a contribution to Grandview athletics, directly or indirectly, as an athlete, coach or administrator

Non-Alumni of Grandview - made a contribution to Grandview athletics, directly or indirectly, as a coach or administrator

Individual who has performed meritorious service for Grandview athletics

Nominations for induction must include the following:

- Nominee Name
 - Graduation year, if known
 - Mailing address, if known
 - Nominator's name, graduating class, address, phone and email
 - In 100 words or less, summarize why nominee should be considered for induction into the Grandview Sports Hall of Fame.


