*Grandview Heights Schools Share New Brand Identity Standards, Visuals with Community*

At the January 12 Grandview Heights Board of Education meeting, Superintendent Andy Culp offered a presentation on the newly created Brand Identity Standards, and unveiled the district's new logos, colors, and typefaces as part of the overall Continuous Improvement Plan.

The intent of Superintendent Culp's presentation was to outline the process that was followed in the creation of the district profile which began in January 2014; to share the district profile and content created to include "our story", "tagline", mission, beliefs, characteristics, and future focus; to share the district's new academic and athletic logos; and finally to share next steps and process for the brand standards to be implemented and used.

Culp thanked the many students, staff, alumni, residents, and community members who participated and contributed citing that this process and these products are truly a culmination of community reflection and input.

Culp said that a steady transition into using the new brand identity standards is occurring. You will see the new look on the district website, school community newsletter, and in district communications.

# Sid Hall '53



The personalized license plate on Sid Hall's maroon Nissan Quest says it all: SIDSWIM.

Hall outdid himself at the National Senior Games July of 2015 at the University of Minnesota Aquatic Center in Minneapolis. The ageless Hall struck gold in all five swimming events in which he competed!

"I've never taken gold in everything and I'll probably never do it again," Hall said. "It is something I felt very fortunate to do. I never would have thought it was possible in my wildest dreams."

At 79 years old, Hall competed in the 80 to 84 age division, "I'm a month shy of my 80th birthday, but we are grouped by year," he said. Hall won the 50-yard backstroke, 50-yard freestyle, 100-yard freestyle, 200-yard freestyle, and 500-yard freestyle, and he won them all.

A multi-sport athlete Bobcat, Hall was a three-time state swimming meet qualifier and two-time state champion. He won a state title in the 100-yard freestyle as a junior and the 50-yard freestyle as a senior, and was a two-time high school All-American before graduating in 1953.

"Then I took what I call a 37-year taper," Hall joked. "I didn't start back until 1991. I didn't do much swimming at all. It was after I heard about the Senior Olympics that I decided I would see if I could train and qualify."

He competed in the Senior Games for the first time in 1993 in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. He returned to the Senior Games in Tucson, Arizona in 1997, and in Orlando, Florida in 1999 before winning his first gold medal in 2001 back in Baton Rouge. With this year's haul, Hall now has 17 gold medals.

"I didn't start out winning. The first Senior Olympics I entered I got a third, two fourths, a sixth, and an eighth," Hall said. "But I have been able to progress some."

So what drives Hall to keep competing?

"It gives me something to shoot for and it keeps me healthy," he said. "I would swim some, but I wouldn't really train if I didn't have a goal in mind. It's the competition along with the fact that, as you get older, swimming is something you can do that doesn't punish your body. It's helped me with my health and allowed me to remain active at my age."

Hall has no intention of slowing down. "Life is an endurance contest," he said, "not a sprint."

## Tim Klitch



Tim Klitch '79 was a four-year member of the varsity tennis team. Tim played as the team's #2 player his freshman season and served in the team's #1 spot his sophomore through senior seasons. During his senior season, he won the district and finished 3rd at the state tournament. That season, he had a record of 23-3 at the #1 singles.

After graduating from GHHS, Tim went to Kalamazoo College his freshman year, then transferred to Miami University his sophomore year and walked onto the tennis team. During his career at Miami, he went undefeated in MAC singles and finished with an overall record of 35-1 in conference singles and doubles play. He also won three individual MAC championships, and was part of two team championships during his collegiate career.

Tim briefly played on the pro tennis tour after graduating

Miami. When his tennis career ended, he had earned a world ranking of 800.

Tim began his banking career in Austin, Texas, and continued playing tennis. He has been ranked #1 in Texas in multiple age groups. He was a part of five city team championships, two sectional team titles, and ten club championships at Westwood Country Club. And, he was named men's Player of the Year in 2014 continuing his family tradition of lifelong involvement in tennis.

Tim still resides in Austin, with his wife Barbara, and is the father of three sons. He has been in the financial services industry for 35 years.

## Nick Barte



Nick Barte '02 was a four-sport athlete earning a total of 11 varsity letters in wrestling, baseball, golf, and football. A four-year letter winner and two-time captain in wrestling for coach

and fellow Hall of Famer Andy DiSabato, Nick was a three-time district qualifier and two-time state qualifier. He finished as the state runner-up his senior year in the 189lb weight class. That year, he was also a vital member of the wrestling team that finished 3rd overall in the state and 3rd at the state duals.

Nick was also a three-time letter winner and captain of the baseball team. During his senior season, he led the Bobcats to a 27-7 record that included a Buckeye Athletic Conference championship and a district championship. As a starting pitcher, he led the Bobcats with a 14-1 record, 137 strikeouts and a 0.46 ERA in 77 and 2/3 innings. These stats were tops for all of central Ohio in 2002, a year that Nick was named to the BAC All-Conference Team and was also named Conference Player of the Year. In addition, he was named Central District Player of the Year and earned the state honor of Mizuno All-Ohio.

Nick was also a three-time letter winner for the golf team. During his three seasons on the links, the Bobcats were BAC champions each year. As a senior, Nick joined the football team and lettered as the starting quarterback. After graduating from GHHS, Nick attended Eastern Kentucky University on a baseball scholarship. He was a four-year starter while earning a B.S.

in mathematics education. He also earned his Master's degree from Cumberland University.

## Tom Cavanaugh



Tom Cavanaugh '68 earned four varsity letters: Two in tennis and two in basketball. While in high school, Tom began a 50-year personal dedication to GHHS athletics adding a tremendous amount to the Bobcat athletic tradition and to the students' sports experience.

After high school, Tom enlisted in the United States Navy. He attended several "A" schools before being sent to Vietnam as a Seabee. He was honorably discharged in 1972. Upon returning to civilian life, he started college, worked part-time, and volunteered at GHHS. Fellow Hall of Famer Larry Larson talked Tom into helping the football team which served as the beginning of his admirable and inspiring volunteering career that continues today. Over the years, he branched out to volun-



“BOZE”

Most every adult Bobcat knows that we all enjoyed something uniquely special at Grandview - the community, the schools, the opportunities... As is so true with most of life, it's the people that make things special, memorable, and impactful. Growing up Bobcat meant we were extremely fortunate to benefit from so many teachers and coaches of the highest caliber who graced the halls and playing fields of 43212 leading students to success. There were many “greats” and many “legends”.



Today, we feature Ed Bozeman, affectionately known as “Boze”.

Currently a London, Ohio resident, Ed Bozeman was a 1964 graduate of Franklin Heights High School where he earned letters in football, basketball, and baseball. He also served as his senior class president. He attended and graduated from The Ohio State University in 1968. That same year he married his high school sweetheart, Priscilla, and also was hired by Grandview Heights High School. At age 24 and barely older than the students he was responsible for, straight out of college Bozeman was hired to teach freshman English and American literature. He was also named head cross country coach and assistant track coach.

A well-respected teacher whom many students adored, Bozeman became an unassuming legendary coach. He came to Grandview never having coached track or cross country. Nor was he a runner. Legend has it that, as a kid, he went out for cross country his freshman year at Franklin Heights, and whereas all the other runners were timed with a stopwatch, Ed was timed with a calendar! This is a far cry from the coach that laced up to run alongside the students he coached coaxing Friday night killer runs out of his team.

Bozeman inherited a less-than-adequate cinder track, but produced several excellent distance runners his first few years. Students took notice, and two second-tier sports quickly became first-tier choices among many student athletes. He made kids want to run. For him. For the school. That early success enabled him to build a competitive program which only got better as the years passed.

During his tenure, Bozeman coached ten teams to league championships, eight district

championships, and seven district runner-up finishes. He took six teams to state finals - one 2nd place team, one 5th place, two 13th places, and one 16th place finish. Bozeman trained a number of individual All-Ohio runners and All-Ohio academic athletes.

Bozeman gives much of the credit for the track and cross country program success to two groups. First he credits peer coaches - John Corona, Bill Colburn, Harry Hauenstein, Teri Antolino Williams, Jim Tatman,

David Janusz, and Rob Ballinger. Second, he credits the students - both in the classroom and his runners - saying they did all the work, saying that he just

showed them how to get their job done.

Touching hundreds of athletes with his uplifting and positive methods of motivation around the track, Bozeman employed similar methods in the classroom where he coached his students to academic success. To this day, he is fondly remembered by three decades of students:

"Mr. Bozeman was my favorite coach at Grandview. He cared so much – he was like a second father to me. Boze was a lot of fun!"

From 1968 and retiring in 1998, Ed Bozeman coached track and/or cross country, boys and/or girls, in some combination every single one of those 30 years. He taught hundreds how to appreciate the written word and express themselves the same. Beyond English courses, he also taught Physical Education for a time. He never

taught or coached at any other school. After nearly 40 years of marriage, wife Priscilla passed away in 2007 after a three-year battle with cancer. They raised two daughters. Emily, now 40, lives in London, Ohio with her husband and two children, and Carrie, 37, a teacher, lives in Carmel, Indiana with her husband. He was inducted into the Sports Hall of Fame in 2005.

On behalf of every student taught and every athlete coached, thank you Boze. You made a difference. You did.

Boze celebrated his 70th birthday in April. Happy Birthday, Boze!

(Hahn) in Columbus, Ohio December 25, 1929, she graduated from Grandview in 1947, and headed for Hollywood. First working at the Pancho Barnes 'Fly in Ranch' which was featured in the film "All the Right Stuff", Miki was in charge of the pool where the test pilots hung out, Chuck Yeager included.

Under contract with RKO, then owned by Howard Hughes, she swam for Jane Russell as her double in the movie "Underwater", and acted with Vincent Price in "The House of Wax". She double-dated with Howard Hughes as a starlet.

She married Ben Shapiro in the late 1950s and together they owned The Renaissance on Sunset Strip, Hollywood. Miles Davis, Gerry Mulligan, Paul Horn, and other jazz musicians entertained there for the Hollywood "in" crowd such as John Saxon, Dennis Hopper, and Steve McQueen, to name a few. Their closing night in the 1960s was hosted by Lenny Bruce, the raw standup comic.

Her life was buoyant with entertainment friends and artists as Ben went on with

M.C.A. as agent to Miles Davis, the Kingston Trio, the Brother's Four, the Limelighter's, and Peter, Paul and Mary. Ben co-produced "What's Up Tiger Lily" with Woody Allen. Miki and Ben moved to Yelapa, Mexico in the mid-1960s. Miki remained in Yelapa after Ben's death in 1984 staying until 2001 when she returned to L.A. because of ill health. Forever avant garde, she took a path of her own choosing, one less traveled.

She was preceded in death by her father Addison McNabb, husband Ben Shapiro, son Robert Tuton, and mother Thelma McNabb Hahn.

She is survived by two daughters Michelle Gannes and Tali Shapiro, brother Robert McNabb '45, sister Victoria Wheeler '60, and two grandchildren in CA.

I got a book for Christmas on 100 things to know about OSU football and I was making margin notes on things the author missed and that reminded me of Tad Weed. That led me to review the time Grandview beat Paul Brown's NFL champs!

In the 1950 season, Grandview had three future college standouts on the same team, Ralph Guglielmi (QB), Stan 'Bucko' Jones (tackle), and Tad Weed (place kicker). With such talent, it's ironic that the Bobcats struggled to a 4-5 record that year under new coach Hugh Hindman. (Of note, Hindman later was the OSU Athletic Director that had to fire Woody Hayes.) Bucko went to Miami and became all-MAC, while Guglielmi and Weed became All-Americans at Notre Dame and Ohio State, respectively.

In those days, the college All-Stars gathered together after their senior years to play

the current NFL pro champs in a pre-season extravaganza for a Chicago charity. The Hall of Fame game replaced this match up sometime in the 70s. The All-Stars were always underdogs and only won one game out of every three or so. On August 12, 1955, at Soldier Field in Chicago, the college All-Stars played the NFL-champion Cleveland Browns as coached by the legendary Paul Brown, and the All Stars beat the pros 30-27. The stars of the Stars included two Grandview graduates!

Weed, weighing in at a mere 139 pounds, was the scoring leader with 3 field goals and two extra points for 11 points. Guglielmi ran the offense playing the entire game which was contrary to the custom of displaying everyone, and he passed for a touchdown. Headlines listed Weed, Guglielmi, and a running back (Dupre) as the outstanding players. Weed was even carried off the field because of his game-winning FG.

Way to represent, Bobcats!



## The Seals of Service

Most people are familiar with the veteran status of former members of the US Armed Forces branches whose seals were displayed above the article in the recent newsletter. There are two other US uniformed services whose members hold commissions and who are considered veterans when their service is completed. One is the US Public Health Service Commissioned Corps, all of whose members are commissioned officers - both the "regulars" and the "reserves". The other is the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration Commissioned Officer Corps. While USPHS and NOAA officers

are usually serving in domestic billets, both corps can be militarized by presidential order and sent as needed to support or serve in military billets domestic and overseas.

I served in the USPHS as a family physician assigned to Indian Health Service from 1984-1987, with two years on the Navajo reservation in Arizona, and one year on the Nez Perce reservation in northern Idaho. I was one of many physicians who served in the USPHS as payback for medical school scholarships received under the National Health Service Corps scholarship program instituted in the early 1970's to address a projected shortage of physicians and

other medical personnel for an expanding US population.

Many served their time in the nationwide network of Public Health Service hospitals and clinics that treated primarily poor and other underserved US populations. This network was defunded and its facilities either "privatized" or closed under the Reagan administration. Many continue to serve those populations in both urban and rural areas in the not-for-profit Community Health Centers that succeeded the PHS system, but were funded with local, state, and, at times, federal grants. As veterans, they are also be recognized for their dedicated service.

## Today's History Lesson

'In 1924, a levy was placed on the ballot to build a new elementary school to accommodate the growing number of children in homes on the east side of the city.

The proposed \$175,000 levy was defeated in the November election and the district was forced to go to half-day sessions in grades 1-3 because of overcrowding. The issue was again placed on the ballot in November 1925, and passed. It provided \$140,000 for construction of the new school and also funds used to purchase the property on which the high school stadium was built. The older photo shows RLS near the end of the construction in 1926.

The project was completed by the Elford Co., overseen by Harold "Fat" Elford, who previously served as the mayor of Upper Arlington. The delay caused by the 1924 levy failure actually proved beneficial. The number of classrooms was increased from the eight specified in the original plan to 12 because of additional need, and the cost for a building went down by \$8,000 because of timing of the bids. The design was also modified to allow for expansion of an additional four classrooms on each end of the building.

He also has served as an associate professor, teaching courses at Kent State in finance, higher education administration, political science, justice studies, history, paralegal studies and journalism for 19 years. He has been a member of the Faculty Senate and served on the executive committee for three years. Tudor also has served several years as grievance chair of the full-time, non-tenure track chapter of the American Association of University Professors (AAUP-KSU).


