Officials felt that after students had studied, worried, and played together, it was only appropriate that they should worship together.

In this country the custom was first adopted by colleges and universities, and later by high schools. At Fairview, it is customary to hold Baccalaureate at one of the larger churches or temples of the area, and to have clergy of each of the three major faiths present.
